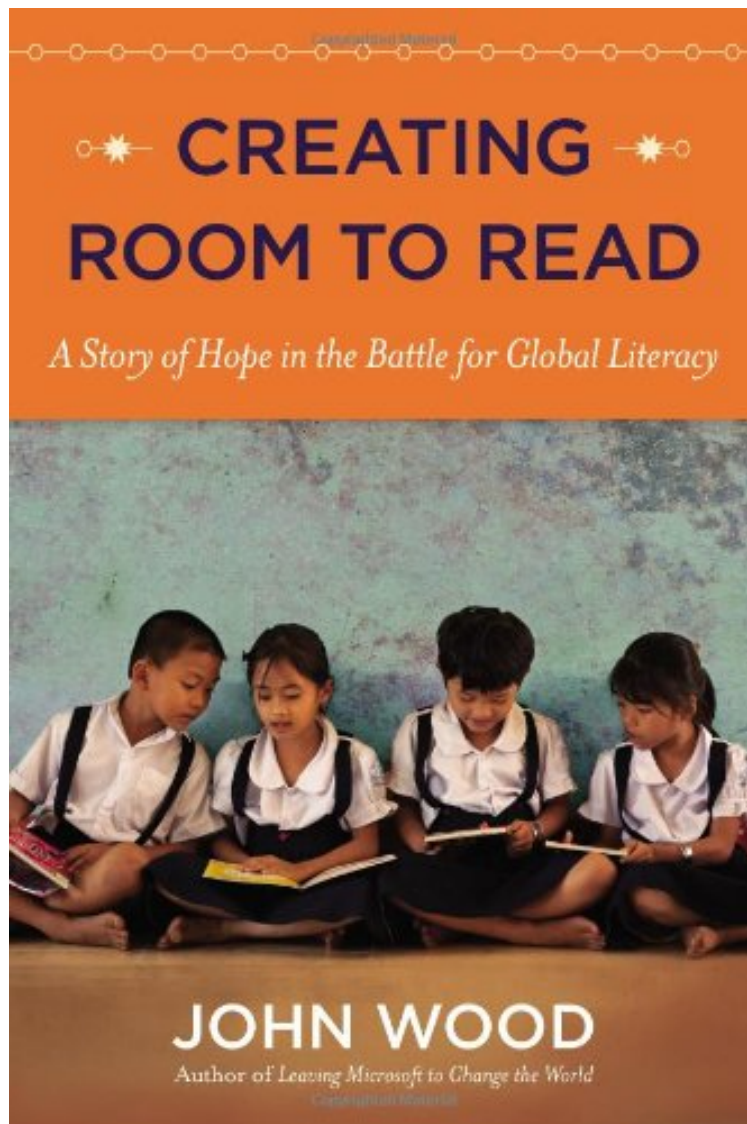

This book picks up where the first book left off, chronicling Room to Read's evolution from its start-up years to its growth to become one of the most highly admired and most effective NGOs on the planet. (The Global Journal just cited Room to Read as one of the top 100 NGOs in the world, for the second year running.)The book includes fascinating accounts of the experiences of some of the key employees who have helped to build the organization. Anyone who has worked in the developing world will appreciate the level of commitment and passion it has taken for these staffers to get the job done on behalf of the children they serve. The book recaps Room to Read's efforts to adapt and embrace change as it grows, in a wildly dynamic economic environment. It's rare that a book recounts experiences that did not go so well. (See the chapter on the start-up year in South Africa.) But Wood's candor in addressing these issues and his growth as a leader provide valuable lessons for other organizations, lending to the credibility of this impressive book. What you'll remember most are the heart-melting personal stories of the kids (and families) whose lives are being forever transformed by a shot at an education. He has authored two books; the first one is Leaving Microsoft to Change the World published in 2011. His first book recollects the memory of visioning and getting started with the mission as Room to Read. The core belief of the organization is just six words: World Change Starts with Educated Children. John Wood had minutely explained and beautifully articulated key events while trekking to Nepal, visiting a school with few or no books in the library, and the basic rights of children to read. He explained how his individual mission of helping one small school in rural Nepal by collecting and sending books from his home expanded to a bigger idea of helping some more in the same country and to other countries in Asia and Africa by creating a strong team. Room to Read now represents an esteemed nonprofit promoting education, gender equality and literacy worldwide.
