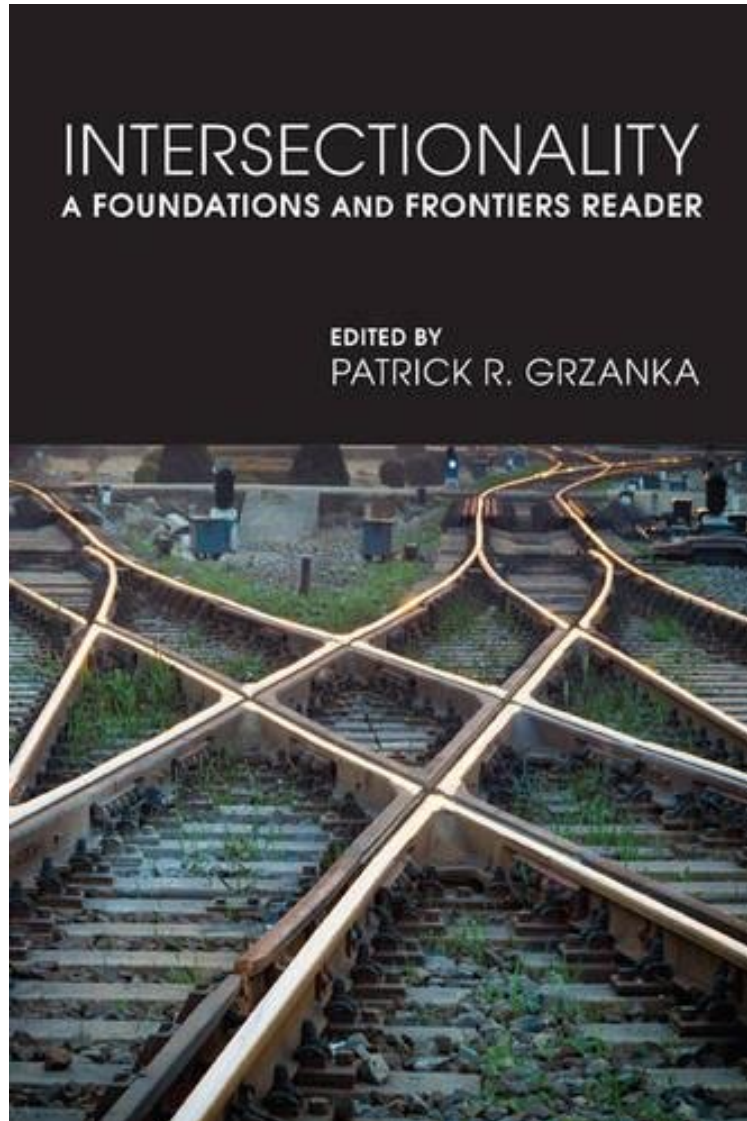

This book compiles a range of works that view sociopolitical phenomena through an intersectional framework--works that may, at times, predate our current understanding of this concept. In addition to expanding our awareness about notions of privilege marginalization, Dr. Grzanka's volume serves as a thought-provoking challenging baseline from which to teach young scholars how to consider our interwoven identities in a way that gives voice vision to those things which may previously go ignored. As someone who has used this text for an advanced undergraduate seminar, I can speak from experience that students respond critically to the material. They are challenged to view themselves others from a more nuanced perspective. I highly recommend this text to anyone seeking to be an agent of social justice, to curiously explore social identities systems, or to learn more about themselves by raising awareness of complex differences similarities that exist among us.
