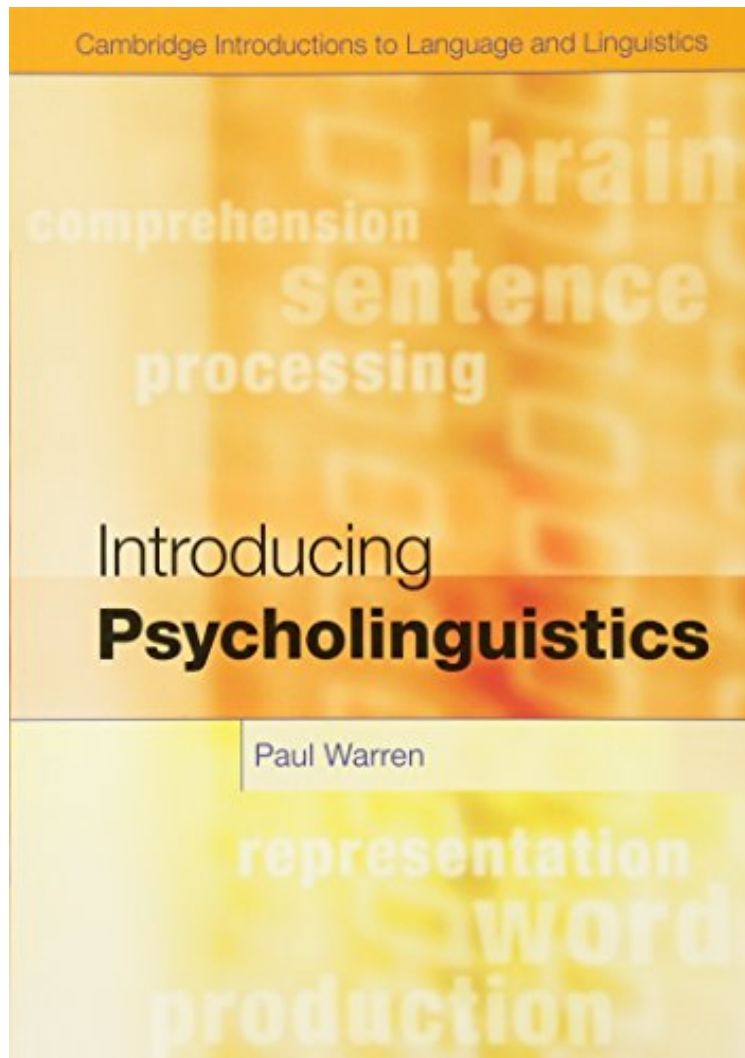

Let's take 12.4 Anaphora as an example, in this textbook, it explains anaphora as: "Anaphora is an example of repeated mention -- the anaphor is the second or subsequent mention of the object, person or action referred to initially by the antecedent." That's it. No examples follow. It is a very precise statement or a definition. But I still have no idea what

anaphora is. So let's look at how "Collins Dictionary" explains this concept: "N the use of a word such as a pronoun that has the same reference as a word previously used in the same discourse. Psycholinguistics is the study of how humans produce and understand language. This textbook provides a clear introduction to the subject for students with a basic knowledge of linguistics. It introduces central aspects of the production and comprehension of language and breaks them down into stages for ease of understanding. Students will also investigate how different production and comprehension processes interact. Looks at how language is processed and represented and how to apply this to the analysis of data. Considers everyday linguistic knowledge (such as the information we store for words, what rule systems we have for generating word and sentence structures) and how it relates to the structures and rules proposed by theoretical linguistics. Examples and exercises reinforce key points. Students become familiar with key terms and concepts with sidebar boxes that explain them as they are introduced, a comprehensive glossary and online flashcard facility
