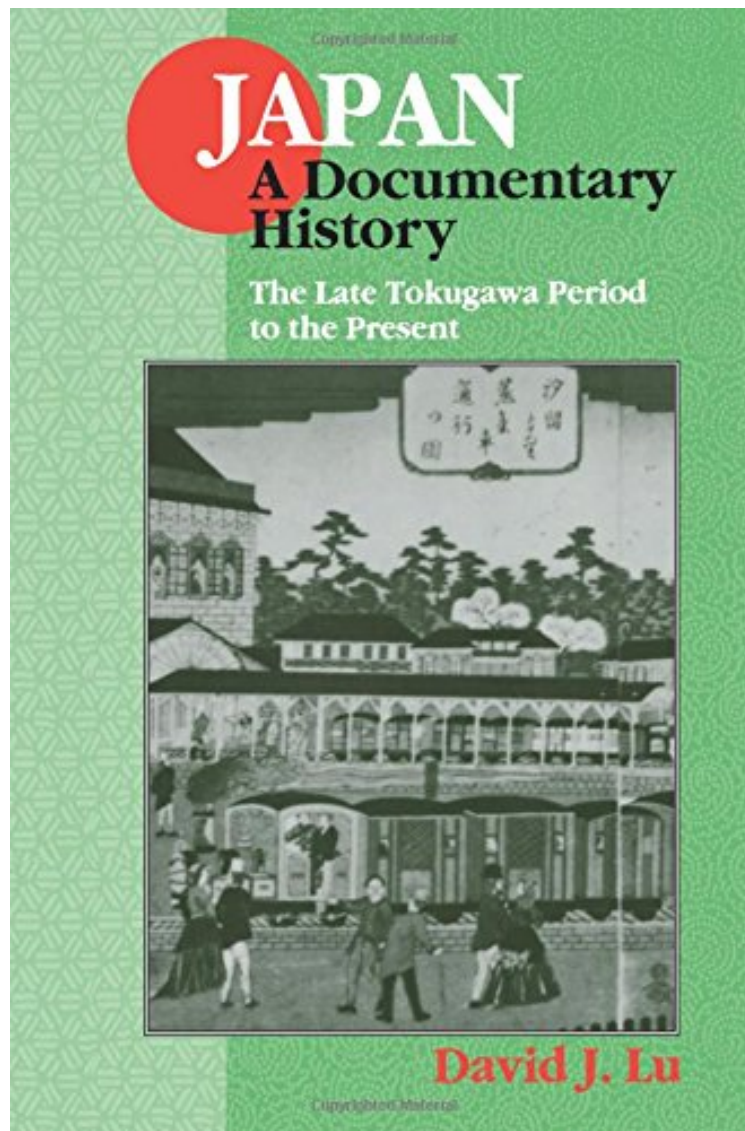

translations, that's what this book is. There are some interesting and important nuggets in there too depending on what you're looking for. This book is not for the casual reader, you really need to look at the preview and see what topics are listed and decide if you want to read through countless translations to glean something meaningful from them. Update Sep 2016: Of course I bought this book for a specific purpose and that was the basis for my initial review. Having said that, now after using the book for a while, I can give a better update to some of its finer points: First- after my initial read, I found it confusing but now I have noticed that I keep picking this book up and reading the translated documents more and more as a companion to my various other books on Japan subjects. This book has many of the works cited in the Japanese history and society books by prominent scholars like Hall, Samson, etc. When I read one of their cited notes (originally in Japanese), I reach for this book to look up the English translation. Very handy. Second- this book has the original medieval (Japanese) document translation for useful things like land records, taxes, legal, etc. and doesn't add too much of the author's "educated opinion" other than to help explain what you are reading. This leaves you, the reader, room to make your own observations rather than wondering if what the author wrote was still the "official" view of a particular topic. Third- With research on medieval Japan still being studied by western scholars using newly translated works like this, you can't go wrong with having the original text in hand to help you understand the arguments many authors are making for their case on various subjects. Three major criteria used in the document selection were that: the selection avoids duplication with other collections - 75% of the documents presented here are newly translated; a document accurately reflects the spirit of the times and the life-styles of the people; and emphasis is on the development of social, economic and political institutions.
