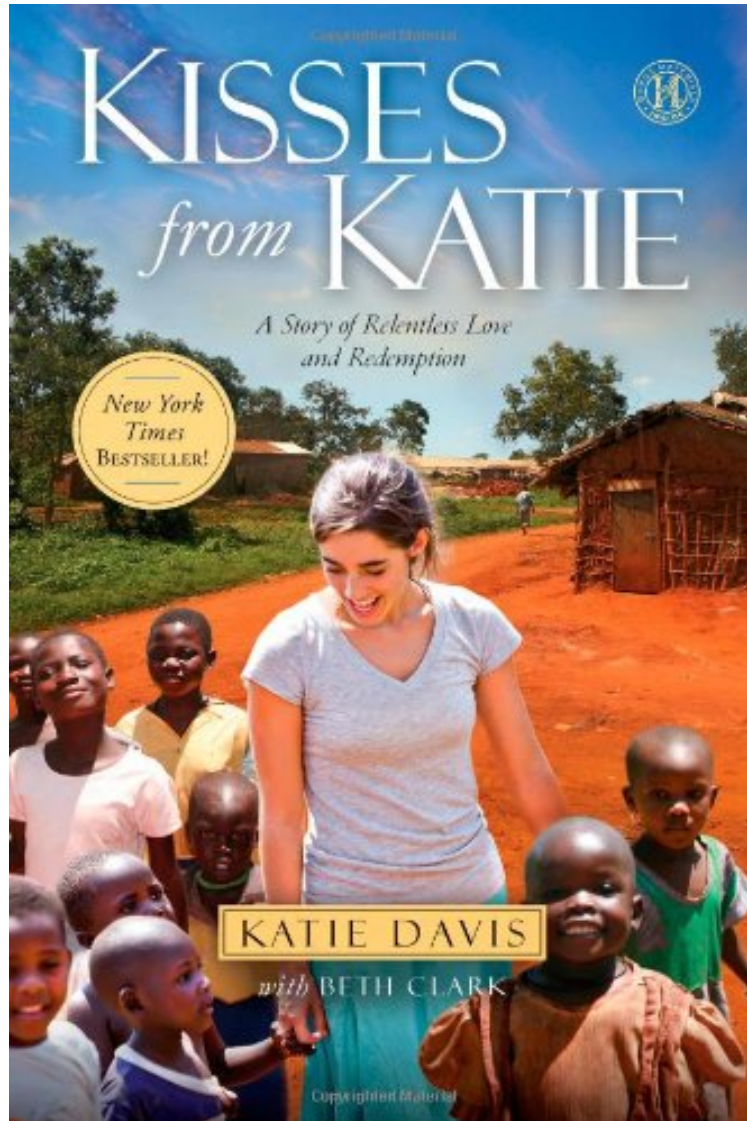

Her willingness to share her heart's struggles when she is most vulnerable is as humbling as it is inspiring! How many U.S. teens do you know who would give up shopping at the mall, hanging out with friends, a comfortable, clean, no worries lifestyle, going to the movies with friends, a college education, even willing to give up a wonderful Christian boyfriend, to go serve in a third world country where she is surrounded by contagious, sick, hungry, impoverished, people-many of whom are orphans and dying from Aids. Despite the overwhelming suffering and oppressive hopelessness, Katie is out to change the world one person at a time, beginning with whomever God chooses to place in her path that day.
