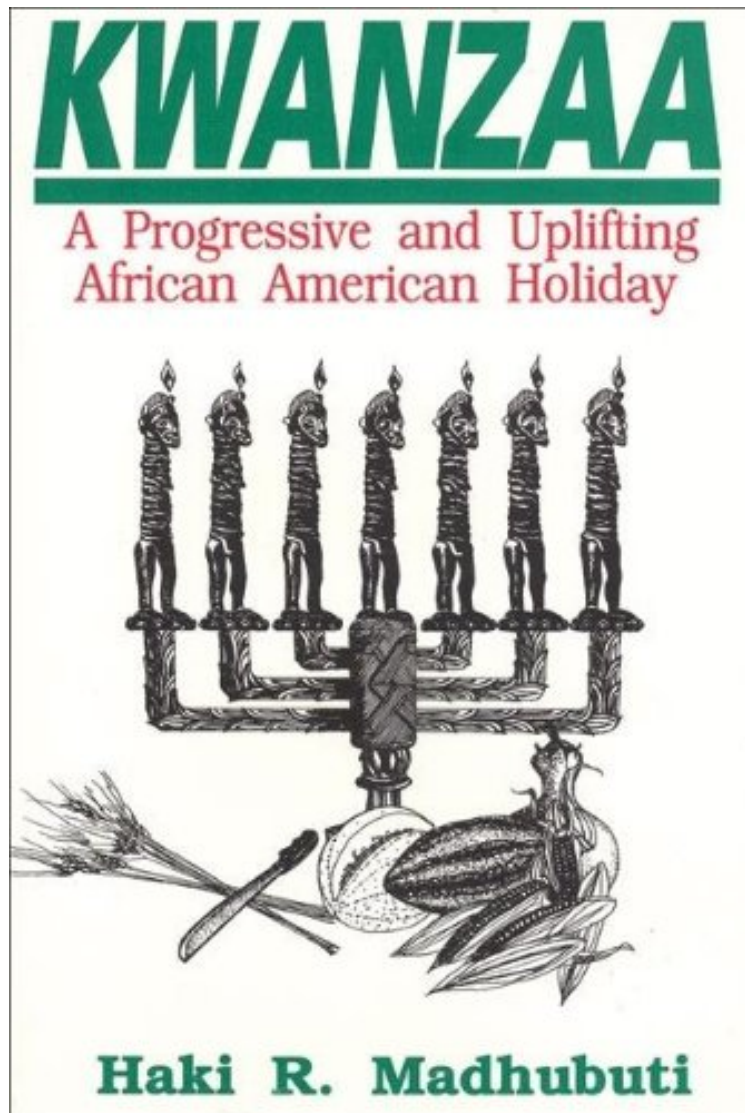

However, according to Dr. Karenga's book, *The African American Holiday of Kwanzaa (A celebration of Family, Community Culture)*, during the first Kwanzaa he added an additional a to Kwanzaa so that all of the children at the performance could participate.

This 16-page booklet was published in 1972, and was one of the first explanations of Kwanzaa (proposed in 1966 by Maulana Karenga, author of books such as *Kwanzaa: origin, concepts, practice*, *The African American Holiday of Kwanzaa: A Celebration of Family, Community Culture*, and *Kwanzaa: A Celebration of Family, Community and Culture*). The book briefly explains the creation of Kwanzaa; the Seven Principles; the Symbols of Kwanzaa; the Karamu (feast), and has a pronunciation guide.

Informative and insightful, this book is a complete guide to celebrating Kwanzaa.
