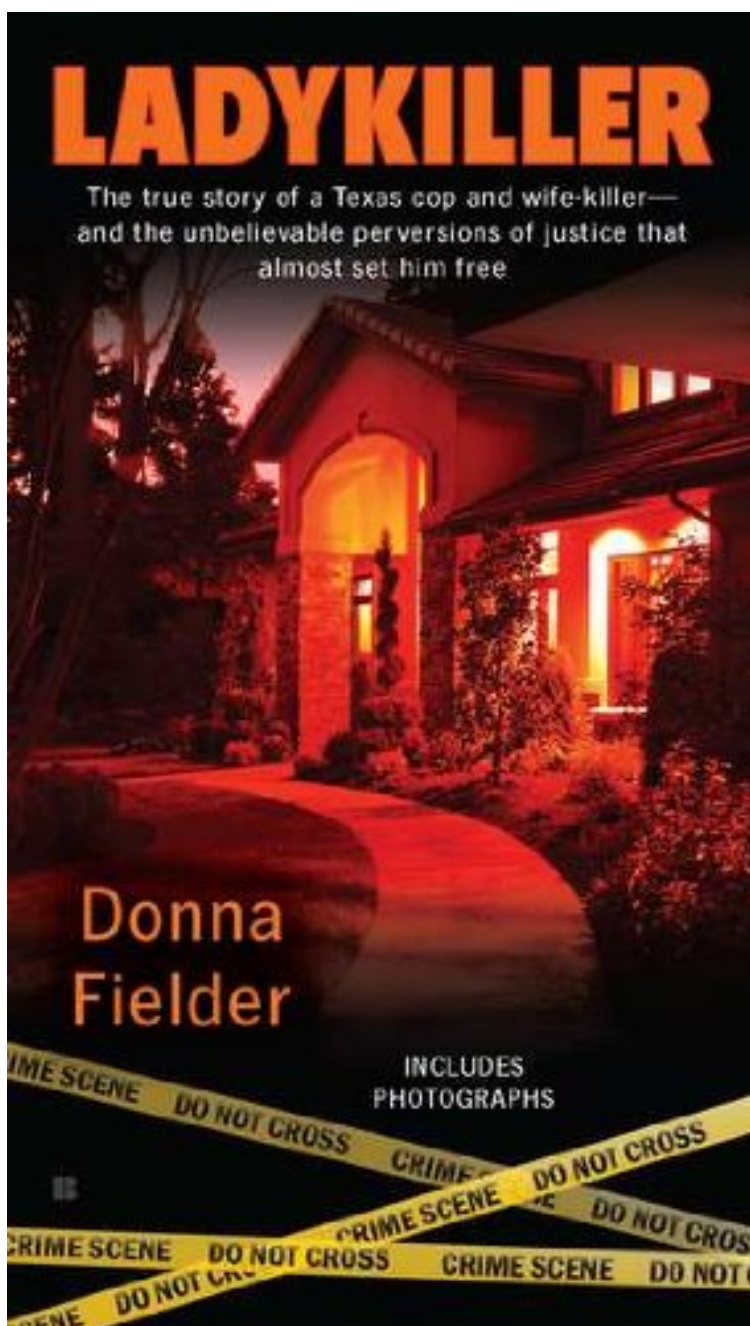

Many of the players are still employed by the city of Denton/Denton county. Having become a crime victim myself in Denton and having experienced a lack of professionalism by the Denton PD, now headed up by Chief Lee Howell, it is easy to assume that there is more to the story concerning Lozano's near escape from justice. The suspects in my case were never arrested or charged even though the evidence collected in my case warranted such action. Her husband, the womanizing, dapper cop became a suspect in her death, but the case went nowhere until investigative journalist Donna Fielder, after watching the case languish for six years, wrote a piece that put the case together for prosecutors and got them moving in the right direction. This story is utterly tragic, not just because of Viki's death, but because her husband was a uniquely despicable man, and worse yet, her mother testified for the defense at trial. Viki, a lovely and dedicated elementary teacher with an eleventh month old -baby didn't deserve the life and death she'd endured. You'll find yourself shaking your head wondering how this incredible series of events could have unfolded. The book is very well written and will keep you up well into the night. Even more shocking, the indictment was vacated when the DA, in a sworn affidavit, said that the medical examiner had changed his mind and ruled the death a suicide. Case closed. For six long years the case languished in limbo...until one reporter discovered that the DAs affidavit was full of lies, and her expos blew the lid off the case. The fight to avenge Vikis brutal murder was just beginning.
