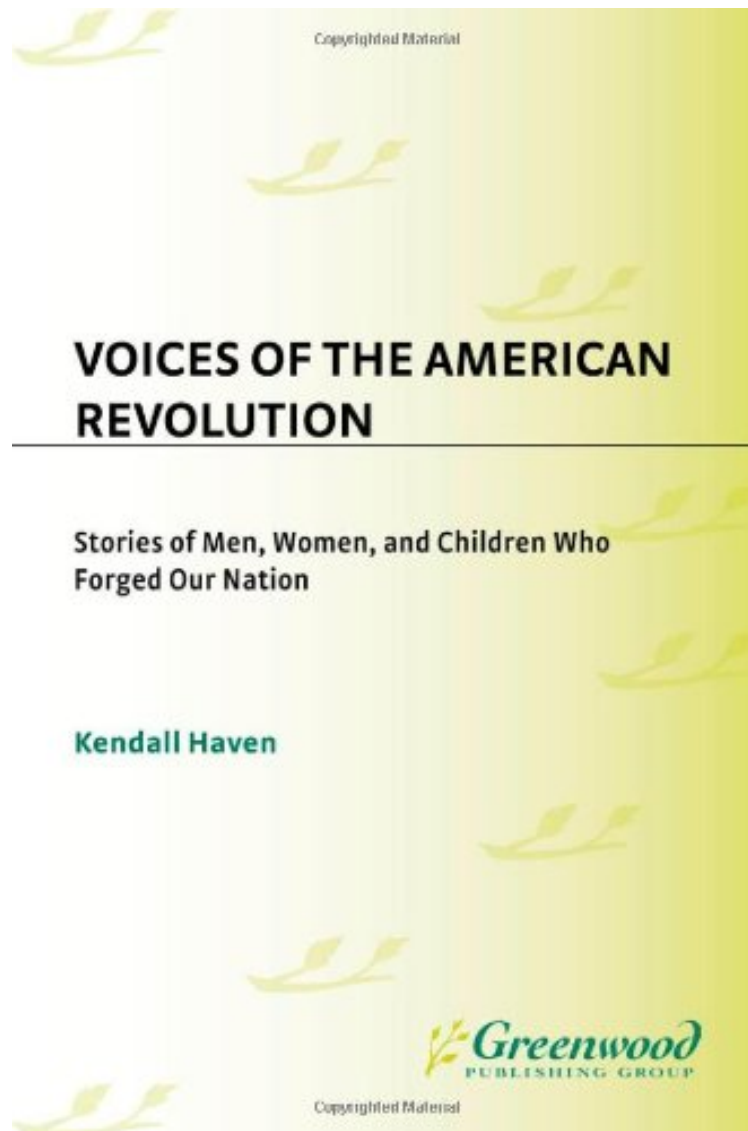

Obviously the author just made this stuff up. Atlee's real biography is available on wikipedia, and his journal of the battle is in the Library of Congress. The bio and journal little resemble the stuff this fellow wrote. What a creep -- just make stuff up as you go along!
