Iroquois Confederacy until his passing recently. The Epilogue was written by John Mohawk, an Elder, and historian who has also moved further on his path. This book is the story of the Peacemaker, who was able to walk into tribal communities who had been battling with each other and convince them to make peace with each other. The concept that he proposed has worked very effectively for several decades. Ben Franklin and other leaders met with members of the tribes and incorporated many of the ideas into the Constitution of the United States.
