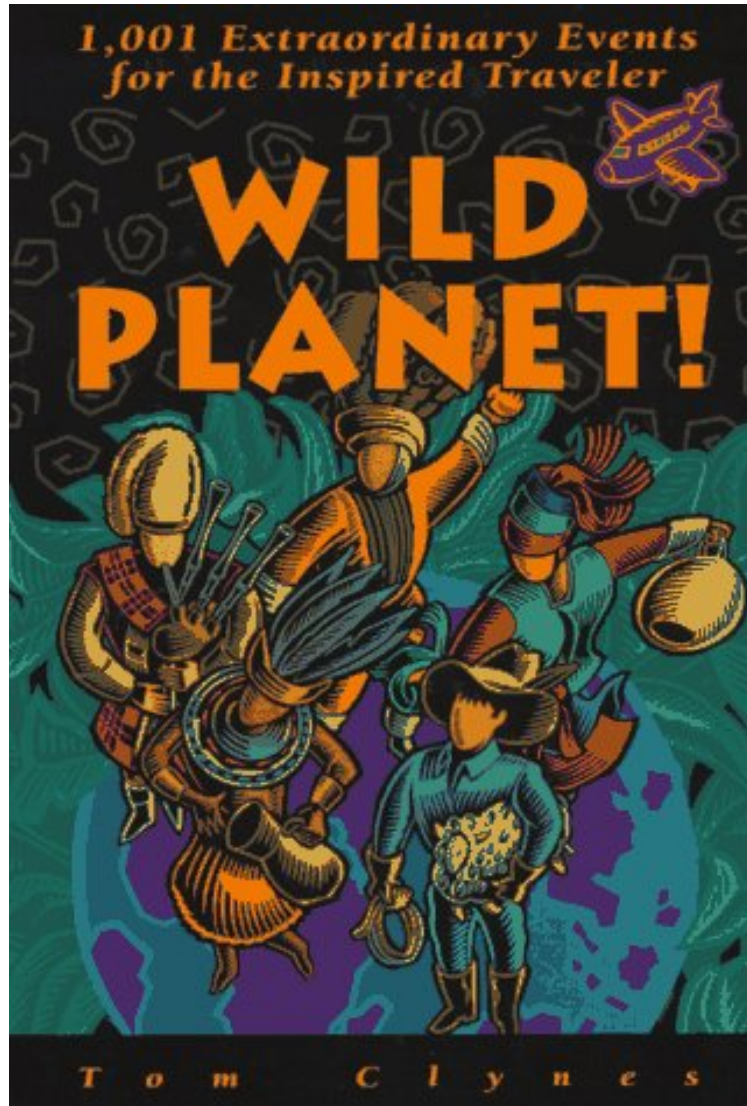

The contents are by continent. Want to plan something for a specific month? The index gives you what's happening where by month - then gives you the page for details. Happen to be in The American Northeast and have a spare day? There's a section after each event titled "WHILE YOU ARE THERE" and gives you other points of interest. Want more information? You date the date of the event, location, transportation info, where to stay and CONTACT INFO - win! Need more info about the country or city? There's that too every 6 to 10 pages. Don't care where or when but it needs to be about one of 500 things under the sun? Find it in the index super easy. Got this eye catching guide from the Library.
