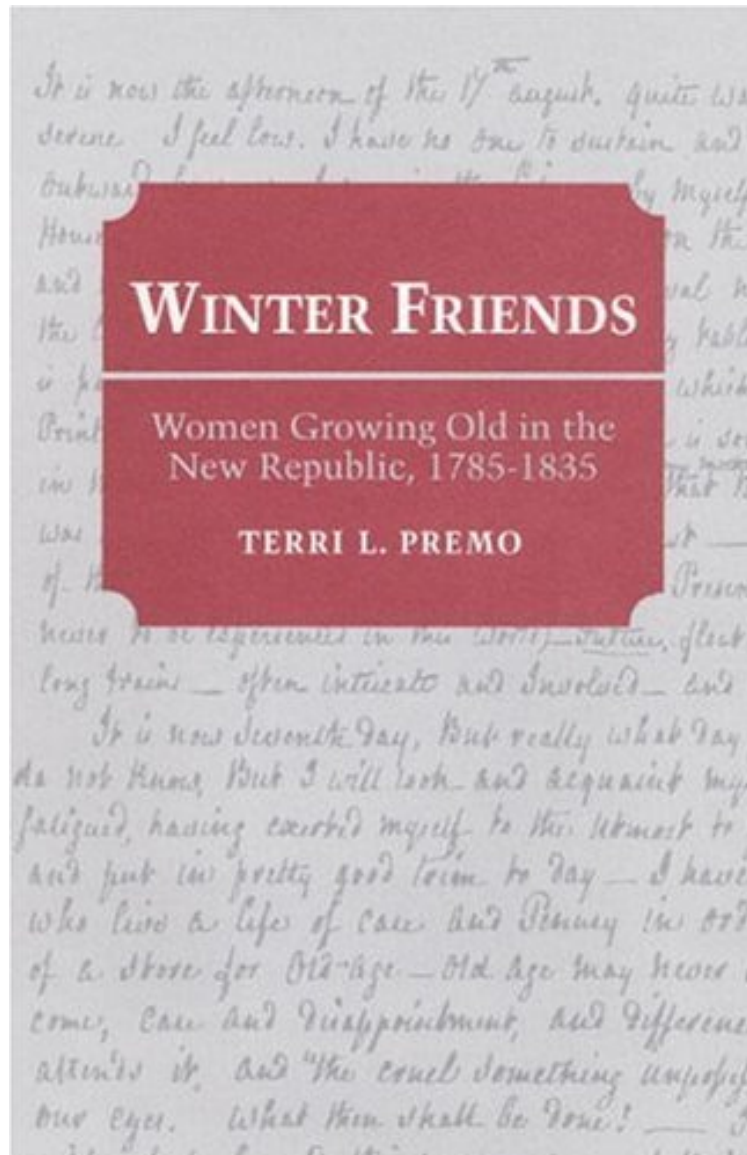


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Winter Friends: Women Growing Old in the New Republic, 1785-1835 (Women in American History)
