Women in Modern America By A Customer The book, Women in Modern America objective succeeds early on in its presentation. The countless documented cases and events seem to support the Authors view. Women endured an unbelievable amount of suffrage and bias from men and even women sometimes. From education, the right to decide where to live, property rights, voting rights, motherhood, and aging women experienced tremendous suffrage. And the Heroines, not all women suffered. And those in the 1920s revealed much about attitudes towards women.
